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## ABOUT US

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King Edward Memorial Hospital provides tertiary level Obstetric, Gynaecological and Neonatal care. The Hospital has an in-patient capacity of 270 beds, including a 80 cot Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. Princess Margaret Hospital provides tertiary level care for the children of Western Australia including a 25 cot surgical Neonatal Intensive Care Unit for babies requiring specialised care. These two hospitals make up the Women's and Children's Health Service of Western Australia.

Newborn babies from all over the state are admitted to these units. We have a highly skilled multi-disciplinary team to provide specialised care for babies and their families including transport from peripheral hospitals.

The Neonatology Clinical Care Unit follows the PARENT, INFANT AND FAMILY CHARTER in providing high quality family centred care:

- Providing optimal care for all infants admitted to our unit.
- Providing support to parents, family and infant.
- Keeping parents informed about the status of their infant by discussing all care with them.
- Being sensitive and flexible in our approach to each family's individual needs.
- Ensuring parents are involved in the care of their infant.
- Providing support and home visiting after discharge for infants who require follow up care.
- Providing teaching for parents.
