Kaya (Hello), I am Acting Aboriginal Senior Health Promotion Officer (ASHPO) here in King Edward Memorial Hospital (KEMH) until the end of April 2018 while Janinne Gliddon is on leave. I am available Monday to Friday and can be found in the Women and Newborn Health Service Library.

The role of the ASHPO includes:

- Identify what resources are currently being used that are specific to Aboriginal women at KEMH and create culturally appropriate resources for Aboriginal women attending KEMH.
- Liaising and supporting patients in KEMH and Agnes Walsh House (AWH).
- Coordinating the Aboriginal Volunteers Program in partnership with Women and Infants Research Foundation (WIRF).
- Present at Women and Newborn Health Service (WNHS) inductions about the ASHPO role and cultural awareness talks.
- Delivering activities for Aboriginal women at Ngalla Mia whilst providing a safe space for the women to interact with one another.
- Liaising and collaborating with stakeholders within KEMH and external health agencies and consumers to identify and promote initiatives aimed at improving Aboriginal maternal and infant health and gynaecological concerns.
- Plan events at KEMH to promote Aboriginal culture and significant culturally events.
