VTE: Heparin therapy: Intravenous

Key points

- 1. If a woman requires intravenous (IV) heparin therapy at KEMH, it is to be supervised by a Haematologist/Physician.
- 2. The IV heparin is to be prescribed on the Anticoagulation Medication Chart MR 810.11.
- 3. The initial bolus (if required) and starting infusion rate are to be advised by Haematologist /Physician.
- 4. The APTT is to be tested within 6 hours of commencing IV heparin or as advised by Haematologist/Physician.
- 5. The Haematologist/Physician is to be contacted with the APTT result and will advise on infusion rate and further APTT tests. They will also advise on target APTT for the patient.
