Presentation	Tablet: 10mg Injection: 20mg/mL
Dose	<u>Acute GI spasm</u> Oral: 10 - 20mg 3 to 4 times a day IV Injection: 20 - 40mg up to every 30 minutes. Maximum daily dose of 100mg
Administration	<u>IV injection</u> Administration: IV Injection: Slow IV over 3 to 5 minutes <u>IM injection</u> Administration: IM Injection: Inject into a large muscle <u>Subcut injection</u> Administration: Subcut Injection: Suitable in palliative care patients as an intermittent injection or as a continuous subcutaneous infusion
Pregnancy	1st Trimester: Considered safe to use 2nd Trimester: Considered safe to use 3rd Trimester: Considered safe to use
Breastfeeding	Considered safe to use
