	Immediate release tablets: Refer to Preterm Labour and PPROM			
	Hypertension or Angina			
	Oral:			
	Immediate release tablets: Initially 10–20 mg twice daily, increase to 20–40 mg twice daily			
	Slow release tablets: Initially 30 mg once daily, increase slowly as required to maximum dose (see below)			
	Maximum daily dose			
	Angina: 90mg			
	Acute hypertension: 40mg per episode			
	Hypertension, Tocolysis: 120mg			
Administration	Oral:			
	Immediate release tablets for tocolysis: The first 2 doses should be crushed or chewed to increase the rate of absorption			
	Slow release tablets: Swallow tablet whole, do not crush or chew.			
Pregnancy	1 <sup>st</sup> Trimester: Considered safe to use			
	2 <sup>nd</sup> Trimester: Considered safe to use			
	3 <sup>rd</sup> Trimester: Considered safe to use
