Scope (Area):	Obstetrics and Gynaecology Directorate clinical areas at WNHS (KEMH and OPH)		

This document should be read in conjunction with this **Disclaimer**

Hospital based MGP's are 'all risk' models of care, with midwives providing womencentred care across the continuum in collaboration with an obstetric team as required.

Exclusion criteria

- Shared Care with General Practitioner (GP) or Privately Practicing Midwife (PPM)
- Women who meet the criteria for WANDAS, CAMI and Adolescent Clinic.
 AMGP may consider inclusion of these women.
- OPH Women who meet the criteria for OPH, see: <u>Inclusion and Exclusion</u>
 <u>Criteria for Obstetrics and Gynaecology Services at OPH (OPH)</u>

Inclusion criteria

- In reference to the <u>ACM National Midwifery Guidelines for Consultation and Referral (2021) (external website)</u>, MGP midwives will assume **midwifery** care of women who are level 'A,' 'B' or 'C.' When a variance is identified during a woman's care, midwives use clinical assessment and judgement to determine the appropriate level of consultation and/or referral.
 - Level A: Midwife provides primary care and responsibility during woman's maternity care.
 - Level B: Midwife will consult with a relevant medical practitioner or health care provider and develop a collaborative plan with the midwifery and obstetric teams.



- Level C: The Midwife will refer a woman's care to a relevant medical practitioner or health care provider. A care plan will be developed with the midwifery and obstetric teams and the midwife with continue to provide care with documented care plan led by the medical team.
- Able to attend all routine antenatal appointments per the Antenatal guideline:
 Midwifery Care Flowchart.

Allocation

- KEMH
 - o Priority given to clients residing within KEMH catchment.
 - Clients residing outside of catchment may be considered depending on team capacity and client acuity.
- OPH: Women residing outside of OPH catchment are not eligible for care at OPH and MGP.
