Antimicrobial Restriction – Unrestricted

Presentation	Tablet: 100mg		
Dose	Pelvic Inflammatory Disease		
	Refer to Gynaecology (Non-oncological)		
	Chlamydia		
	Refer to Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI)		
	Hysterosalpingogram for infertility		
	Refer to Infections: Antibiotic prophylaxis / medication: Hysterosalpingogram for infertility		
Administration	Oral:		
	Take after food with a full glass of water or milk and remain upright for 1 hour after taking		
	Do not take antacids, iron, calcium supplements (milk ok) or zinc supplements within 2 hours due to reduced drug absorption.		
Pregnancy	1 st Trimester: Consider alternative		
	2 nd Trimester: Contraindicated		
	3 rd Trimester: Contraindicated		
Breastfeeding	Short course of 7-10 days considered safe during breastfeeding		
	Dental staining and enamel hypoplasia possible following prolonged use.		
	Multiple courses or prolonged use is not recommended.		
	Observe the breastfed infant for potential adverse effects such as diarrhoea, vomiting, skin rash or thrush.		
Monitoring	Photosensitivity, oesophageal erosion
