



SARC referral guidelines

For professionals

Patients/clients

- 24-hour crisis medical/forensic/counselling services within 14 days of a sexual assault
- Crisis phone counselling for sexual trauma survivors, 8.30am-11pm
- Counselling appointments for people who have experienced recent or past sexual trauma
- 24-hour phone support to health professionals seeing sexual assault patients

Patients/clients

- 13 years and above
- · All sexualities and gender identities
- Recent or past sexual assault or sexual abuse experiences



Not appropriate for SARC referral

- People with acute psychiatric presentations, including those who are psychotic or suicidal
- People with acute drug and/or alcohol dependencies
- People who have serious injuries or bleeding
 seek assistance at a hospital emergency
 department or call an ambulance on triple 000
- People aged under 13, or aged 13 to 16 with intra-familial abuse or previous child protection concerns - contact the Child Protection Unit at Perth Children's Hospital
- People with any history of sexual perpetration

To refer a patient/client

- Call the SARC duty office to discuss appropriateness of service for patient/client
- SARC duty office will need to speak to a patient/client before a counselling appointment can be offered
